

Online Scholarship Opportunities 2023-2024

Amelia Fickel and Glenn Moodie

For graduates of Perry-Southern Local School District, Ohio. Special consideration given to graduates who are residents of the former New Straitsville School District. Selection shall be based on financial need. May be awarded for a four year, two year vocational or technical college education. Additional question to apply: Are you currently or were you formerly a resident of the former New Straitsville School District?

Ann Chess Fund

This scholarship was established in the memory of Ann Chess. As a career elementary music teacher in the Lancaster City Schools, she delighted in sharing the joy of music with children. She was a tireless and dedicated volunteer to the Lancaster Festival, serving as administrator to the Festival Orchestra and an indispensable contributor to theatre in the area spending many hours involved with the theatre guild at OUL. Scholarships will be awarded to graduating seniors from a high school in Fairfield County attending a four year school, who are majoring in music, arts or theater, with special consideration to Wittenberg University applicants, Ann's alma mater.

Bashore College Trust Fund Scholarship

This scholarship was established by Margaret S. Bashore to be distributed for the purpose of providing educational scholarships for Richland Township residents. Said funds shall be distributed for application toward the tuition expenses of scholarship recipients.

Bess H. Floyd Cultural Arts - Rotary

Bess H. Floyd established a fund in 1995 to provide scholarships to enhance excellence in cultural arts in Lancaster and Fairfield County, Ohio. Eligible applicants should have exhibited a preference for and an interest in the cultural arts by the applicant's high school activities and majoring in the Arts. Must be resident of Fairfield County, Ohio.

Bess H. Floyd Music - Rotary

Bess H. Floyd established a fund in 1991 to provide scholarships to enhance excellence in music in Lancaster and Fairfield County, Ohio. Eligible applicants must be a resident of Fairfield County and should have exhibited a preference for and an interest in music arts by the applicant's high school activities and majoring in Music. Applicant major must be listed as: Music-Other, Music-Vocal, Music Vocal Classical or Music-Instrumental Performance

Billy J. Holbrook Memorial

This scholarship is to honor the memory of Billy J. Holbrook who died in a car accident on Thanksgiving 1998. This is a scholarship to be awarded to a senior at Liberty Union High School, Ohio. No GPA requirements. Recipient must show financial need.

Bleu George Memorial

The Bleu George Memorial fund shall be awarded to a graduating senior from Fairfield County who was a golfer in high school and will continue to golf in college. Must have a high school GPA of 2.5 or higher. Applicants will be required to write an essay about their passion for the game of golf and submit two letters of reference, at least one from a golf coach.

Brian Stoner Memorial

This fund was created in 2011 to memorialize Brian Stoner, a Pickerington, Ohio resident and entrepreneur. Brian's life was full of varying passions, but family and food consistently outranked all of them. Preference, for this scholarship may be given to individuals with autism; individuals with other special needs; individuals intending to major in special education and individuals attending culinary school. If none meet those qualifications, scholarships may be awarded to any applicant.

Bud Goodman Memorial

To be eligible for this scholarship recipients shall have exhibited a livestock project at the Fairfield County Fair, Ohio for a minimum of three years and be a resident of Fairfield County, Ohio. A minimum grade point of 2.5 is required. The scholarship award may be made to a 4 year or 2 year college program or for an accredited vocational or technical school. The scholarship may be used to pay for tuition or for the purchase of books, equipment or tools needed for course work.

Chad Edwards Memorial

The Chad Edwards Memorial Scholarship provides scholarships to graduates of Fairfield County high schools to attend an accredited school or academy in preparation for a career in law enforcement or to further their career in law enforcement.

Chad Welch Memorial

As a memorial to Chad Welch, a scholar-athlete at Liberty-Union, this scholarship honors graduating seniors who have excelled in athletics and academics at Liberty Union in Baltimore, Ohio. Applicants shall have attended Liberty Union High School all four years. The scholarship award may be made for a four year or two year college. A certified technical college education shall also be given consideration.

Charles C. and Barbara Claypool

Established in 1997 to provide a scholarship fund that will make a lasting and significant contribution to certain students seeking educational opportunities in technical fields and especially engineering. Preference shall be given to children of Claypool Electric, Inc. employees and to students who plan on attending Ohio Northern University. Students must have graduated from a high school in Fairfield County, Ohio (except for children of employees).

Charles T. Wilkins

This scholarship is for residents of Lancaster, Ohio and Fairfield County, Ohio.

Clarence and Edna Steenrod - Rotary

Dr. Clarence Steenrod's widow established this fund to recognize the work of her husband who was a distinguished and long-time optometrist in Lancaster. Applicants should have already completed an undergraduate degree and should be starting Optometry school. Must be resident of Fairfield County, Ohio.

Clark M. McGhee and Carol T. McGhee

Established in 2005 by the McGhee Family to award college scholarships to students possessing the following qualifications in order of importance. 1) The student must be a resident of Rushcreek Township, Ohio for at least 12 months 2) The student must be a graduate of Fairfield Union, Ohio High School 3) A resident of Fairfield County, Ohio for at least 12 months

D. A. R. E.

The D.A.R.E. scholarship is for a graduating senior from Lancaster High School, William V. Fisher Catholic High School or Fairfield Christian Academy in Ohio and is a graduate of the DARE Program. Must have a 3.0 G.P.A.

D. Eugene Ward Memorial Scholarship

This scholarship is for Fairfield Christian Academy seniors that are in the college preparation program, who will graduate and attend a two or four year College/University program. Cumulative (9-11 plus first semester Senior year) Grade Point Average of 2.7 and above. A student who has demonstrated high motivation in high school, had qualities of hard work, scholastic achievement, Christian moral values and a love of family and country and has contributed to his/her school and community.

David Boger Memorial - Rotary

Mr. Boger, former math teacher at Lancaster High School, Ohio, was always concerned about the complete development of the total student. His family, friends, former students, co-workers and parents established this fund to provide for the furtherance of excellence in the field of Education for graduates of Lancaster High School, Lancaster, Ohio.

Davidson-Jaycees Community Service

The Davidson-Jaycee Support Group established this scholarship with the purpose of providing scholarships to students of any Fairfield County, Ohio high school who have demonstrated an interest in Community Service through volunteerism. Jaycees and relatives of current or former Jaycees of Lancaster Ohio will be given preference in determining recipients.

Deputy Ethan Collins

This scholarship was established in memory of Deputy Ethan Collins by family and friends. Scholarship recipients shall be a graduate of a Fairfield County, Ohio high school. The scholarship award may be for an accredited school or academy in preparation for a career in Law Enforcement or continuing

education in Law Enforcement. The award may be used to pay tuition or for the purchase of items/uniforms needed for course work.

Doug Henwood Memorial

This fund was established to provide a scholarships for 1. A graduating senior of Lancaster High School, Ohio who participated in track during high school and will participate in track at the collegiate level 2. A graduate of Lancaster High School, Ohio who participated in track during high school and is participating in track at the collegiate level 3. A graduate of Lancaster High School, Ohio who participated in track during high school. Requirements are stated in order of priority.

Dr. Martha Gesling Weber

Family, friends and former students established this memorial scholarship to recognize the accomplishments of Dr. Weber in the field of Education with emphasis on Reading Education. Special consideration will be given to Bowling Green State University, but may be used at any state university. Considerable weight will be given to the candidate's course schedule or involvement in the elementary or secondary schools while requiring a GPA of 3.0 or higher. Must be resident of Fairfield County, Ohio.

Dr. Paul & Mary Magnuson - Rotary

Funds bequeathed by the late Dr. Paul Magnuson have created an endowment for scholarships in Medicine, Dentistry, Optometry and Nursing. Scholarships are awarded on a competitive basis to students enrolled in a program leading to a professional degree. Factors, which may be evaluated, include: academic record, financial need, the applicant's individual situation and activities. Applicants must have a GPA of 3.0 or higher and be a graduate of a Fairfield County, Ohio high school.

Dr. Phil Floyd Dentistry - Rotary

In 1991 Bess H. Floyd established a scholarship in honor of her husband, Dr. Phil Floyd, to provide for the recognition and furtherance of excellence in the field of dentistry, including dental hygiene. Eligible applicants must be a resident of Fairfield County, Ohio

Dr. Thomas E. Stenger

This fund is for the purpose of providing educational scholarships for college students in the manner described below: 1. Applicant must be a graduate of William V. Fisher High School in Ohio 2. Preference given to a degree in the health care field 3. Preference given to a student of good academic standing

Edgar A. Work, Sr.

Mr. Work was the holder of many patents and a life long resident of Fairfield County who provided this opportunity for young people to study at his alma mater. Special consideration shall be given to those graduates who have been accepted and plan to attend the School of Engineering at Purdue University. Recipient must show financial need, must be a graduate of a Fairfield County, Ohio high school and majoring in Engineering.

Elsie R. McClelland Davis Memorial

Elsie R. McClelland Davis, who died in 2000, established this fund for the purpose of providing scholarship grants to qualified graduates of Amanda-Clearcreek High School in Ohio. Recipients must demonstrate a financial need, good character and ability based on their high school transcript and test scores. Must be attending an accredited state supported school.

Erik J. Landis Memorial

This scholarship was established by Erik's parents in honor of their son's love of learning, love of Fairfield Union and his sense of generosity. The scholarship is for graduating seniors of Fairfield Union, Ohio High School. Applicants must be seeking advanced education at any accredited educational institution. The recipient will be determined on the basis of academics, economic need and community involvement.

Eva G. Eyman - Rotary

Eva Eyman was a teacher who received her degree in mid-life. She was an astute investor who regularly worked long hours and was frugal in her life style. Preference is given to students whose families indicate financial need. Must be a resident of Fairfield County, Ohio and attend an Ohio University campus for undergraduate studies. Post-graduate study outside the state of Ohio will be considered. Recipient must maintain an overall GPA of 2.7 or higher and a GPA of 3.2 in designated major area.

Fairfield County Medical Alliance Healthcare Scholarship

The Medical Alliance of Fairfield County was created to give the spouses of the community physicians a chance to give back to the community in which they serve. One way in which the Alliance does this is through awarding scholarships with money that is raised throughout the year. Their goal with these scholarships is to recognize, reward and encourage students who are going in the nursing field. The applicant must show motivation, need and a strong desire to succeed in attaining his/her goal.

Fairfield County Tuberculosis and Respiratory Disease

A scholarship shall be awarded to a student that is seeking a degree as a respiratory therapist. Must be an accredited program. Student must be a graduate of an high school in Fairfield County, Ohio.

Fannie M. Howe Nursing - Rotary

This fund was created to honor Fannie M. Howe. She was the original visiting nurse in Lancaster during the 1930s, 40s, and 50s. She walked all over the city carrying chicken soup and other needed items to the house bound and ill. It was her personal ministry for which she received no compensation. Everyone knew and respected her and at her death, money was given as a memoriam in her honor. Applicants must be a graduate of a Fairfield County, Ohio high school and pursuing a career in Nursing.

Frank P. Maguire Scholarship Fund

This scholarship was established by the Maguire Family in memory of Frank P. Maguire with the purpose of awarding scholarships to students whose parent(s) served, or are serving, in the U.S. military. Students must be a graduate of a high school in Fairfield County, Ohio and must have a GPA of at least 2.7. This scholarship is for tuition only.

George & Marilyn Finnen Education Scholarship

George and Marilyn Finnen were long time teachers at Lancaster City Schools and both graduates of Ohio University. George taught from 1964 to 1996, teaching primarily civics and economics to seniors. Marilyn taught from 1964 to 1994, teaching math to mostly freshman. When she retired she was teaching at Stanbery Freshman School. Both dedicated their life to teaching as a profession. This scholarship is dedicated to their memory and to assist new teachers to follow in their footsteps.

George Sakas Memorial - Rotary

Graduates of a Fairfield or Perry County, Ohio high schools are eligible to apply for this engineering scholarship honoring Mr. Sakas, a successful businessman from Baltimore, Ohio. Preference will be given to biological or legally adopted dependents of Sakas, Inc. employees. The selection decision may be weighted toward those who plan to major at a school in the state of Ohio but shall not exclude out of state colleges. A certified technical school shall be given special consideration.

Glenn R. Burns Dental Education Scholarship

This fund shall be used for the purpose of providing scholarships for residents of Fairfield County who are seeking a degree in Dentistry, Dental Hygiene or as an Expanded Function Dental Auxiliary. The scholarship can be used toward tuition and/or related educational expenses of scholarship recipients.

Hannah E. Thrash

This scholarship is to provide scholarships to enhance excellence in music with an emphasis on voice. Eligible applicants must be a resident of Fairfield County, Ohio and should have exhibited a preference for and an interest in vocal music by the applicant's high school activities.

Henry and Eleanor Hood

Henry and Eleanor Hood created this scholarship to provide assistance to Fairfield County residents who meet the following criteria: 1. Graduate of Lancaster High School 2. Completed LHS STEM program 3. Admitted to an accredited 4-year college or university with the intent to major in Engineering or Bio Medical Sciences. 4. Attending and in good academic standing in an accredited 4-year college or university majoring in Engineering or Bio Medical Sciences.

Hocking Valley Dental Society

This scholarship is for the purpose of providing educational scholarships in the manner described below:

1. Students entering or enrolled in a program for Dental Hygiene or Expanded Functions. 2. Students must be a graduate of a high school within the counties served by the Hocking Valley Dental Society: Fairfield, Perry, Hocking and Athens. 3. A resident of one of these counties or 4. An employee of a dentist in the Hocking Valley Dental Society

Home School Fund

This scholarship is for the purpose of providing educational scholarships for college students in the manner as described: 1. Applicant must be a home schooled student 2. Applicant must be applying to attend a 2 or 4 year College 3. Must be a resident of Fairfield County

Jack and Carol Burton Drugan Engineering

The Jack and Carol Burton Drugan Engineering Scholarship Fund shall be used for the purpose of awarding scholarships to Pickerington Central High School seniors who are majoring in Engineering at an Ohio college.

Jack and Elsie Smith

In 1992 Mrs. Smith established this scholarship for graduates of Fairfield Union High School in Ohio. Special consideration is given to residents of the former Pleasantville School District. The committee shall make its selection based upon the financial situation of applicants. The scholarship award may be made for a four-year, two year or technical college education. Academic achievement shall also be given special consideration.

Jacob Guisinger

This fund was established in memory of Jacob Guisinger to provide scholarships for graduating seniors of Berne Union High School, Ohio. Applicants must be seeking advanced education at any accredited educational institution. The recipient will be determined on the basis of academics, economic need, athletics and community involvement.

Jacob Sims - Rotary

This scholarship was established in 1967 as a memorial to the late Jake Sims, a prominent Lancaster native and Rotarian. This scholarship is for High School Seniors who plan to attend Ohio University-Lancaster their freshman year and are a graduate of a Fairfield County, Ohio high school. Applicants must have a GPA of 3.0 or higher.

James & Viola Wayland Accounting & Computer Science - Rotary

Funds bequeathed by the late James and Viola Wayland have created an endowment for scholarships in accounting or computer science. James Wayland was a CPA who regularly worked 12-hour days and was very frugal in his lifestyle. He and his wife Viola were greatly influenced by having lived through the Great Depression of the 1930's. Recipient must maintain an overall GPA of 2.7 or higher and a GPA of 3.2 in designated major area and be a resident of Fairfield County, Ohio.

James & Viola Wayland Students Choice - Rotary

Funds bequeathed by the late James & Viola Wayland have created an endowment for scholarships in a field of study that the student may choose. James Wayland was a CPA who regularly worked 12-hour days and was very frugal in his lifestyle. He and his wife Viola were greatly influenced by having lived through the Great Depression of the 1930's. Recipient must maintain an overall GPA of 2.7 or higher and a GPA of 3.2 in designated major area. Must be resident of Fairfield County, Ohio.

James Caple

Mr. Caple established this scholarship to be used for the purpose of providing scholarships for post-secondary studies to Fairfield County, Ohio residents who pursue a course of study in classical vocal and instrumental performance. Applicants must have a 2.0 GPA in high school and as an undergraduate and

a 2.7 GPA in a graduate program to demonstrate sufficient academic ability. Letters of recommendation should address the applicant's motivation, character, ability and potential as a performer.

Jean M. Burdette Memorial Scholarship

This scholarship was established in memory of Jean M. Burdette by her husband Neal to provide scholarships for Lancaster High School graduates for study in the field of Special Education.

Jerry Floyd Memorial - Rotary

Bess H. Floyd, wishing to perpetuate the memory of her son, Jerry Floyd, established a scholarship for the recognition and furtherance of excellence in architecture, landscape design and interior design. Eligible applicants must be a resident of Fairfield County, Ohio.

Jim and Sarah Miller-Rotary

This scholarship shall be distributed for the purpose of providing educational scholarships for Fairfield County students in the manner described below: 1. Recipient must be a graduate of a high school in Fairfield County. 2. Recipient must be accepted to or currently attending Law School. 3. Recipient must show proof of community service.

Johnathan Smith Lancaster Bingo Scholarship Fund

The Johnathan Smith Lancaster Bingo Scholarship Fund is to benefit the children or stepchildren of those employed by Lancaster Bingo Company, Inc.

Joseph and PJ Hoover Family Trust

The Hoover Family established this fund for the purpose of providing educational scholarships for graduates of Fairfield Union High School for the study of art education or early childhood education.

Keith Kumler Vocational

Family and friends established this scholarship in memory of Keith Kumler for students who will be attending an accredited vocational or technical school for study in the automotive field. Must be resident of Fairfield County, Ohio.

Kenneth D. And Zita M. Trimmer

1. 75% of this scholarship will be used for graduates of Lancaster High School or Fisher Catholic High School to pursue a Bachelor's degree, from any approved college or university, in Business Administration or a Master's program in Business Administration from Harvard University. 2. 25% of this scholarship will help nursing students from Fisher Catholic High School pursue a course of curriculum for a Bachelor's or Associates degree in nursing in an approved nursing program.

Lancaster Athletic Boosters

The Lancaster Athletic Booster Scholarship is to provide annual scholarships for Lancaster High School student-athletes. Students must meet the following criteria: Minimum high school GPA of 3.0, must have received a minimum of one varsity letter their senior year, attending an accredited 2 or 4 year

university or college, trade school or apprenticeship program. Students must provide letters of recommendation from one varsity coach and one high school teacher.

Lancaster Community Chorus Scholarship

The Lancaster Community Chorus is providing a scholarship opportunity for students wishing to further their education in a post-secondary program while majoring in music education, music therapy or music performance (vocal or instrumental).

Lancaster High Class of 1957 Memorial

For the purpose of providing educational scholarships for Lancaster High School graduates in the manner described below: 1.Recipient must be currently enrolled in or have been accepted into a program leading to a bachelor degree or associates degree; 2.Demonstrated potential for high school or post high academic achievement; and 3.Financial need

Lancaster High School Class of 1959

This scholarship is for a senior graduate of Lancaster High School in the manner described below: 1. Recipient must not be a recipient of any other scholarship. Fairfield County Foundation will confirm with LHS Guidance Department before selection of recipient. 2. Recipient must be attending any post-secondary education program and/or a traditional 4 year college. This could include community college, liberal arts college, universities, vocational schools, trade schools, institutes of technology or professional schools 3. Recipient must be a student who, in the committee's opinion, deserves assistance, even though they have not qualified for other scholarships. 4. Recipient should be involved in school and community activities.

Lancaster High School Class of 1964

This scholarship is for a senior graduate of Lancaster High School in the manner described below: 1. Recipient must not be a recipient of any other scholarship at the time of application. Fairfield County Foundation will confirm with the Lancaster High School Guidance Department, before the selections of the recipient 2. Recipient must be attending any post secondary education program and/or a traditional 4 year college. This could include: community college, liberal arts college, universities, vocational schools, trade schools, institutes of technology or professional schools 3. Recipient must be a student who, in the committee's opinion, deserves assistance, even though they have not qualified for other scholarships 4. Recipient should be involved in school and community activities

Lancaster Junior Women's Club

This fund was established to provide educational scholarships to support high school females, in Lancaster, Ohio, entering their freshman year in an undergraduate college or university program who volunteer in their community, in the manner described below: 1. Female living and attending high school in the city of Lancaster who are already accepted into an undergraduate degree program for the academic year immediately following completing their high school diploma. This would include home schooled or any traditional high school program 2. Cumulative GPA of 3.5 or higher on a 4.0 scale. Please convert any weighted GPA scoring to 4.0 scale scoring equivalent. 3. Volunteers for a certified 501(c)3

organization for a minimum 20 hours in the prior 12 months from submitting the application. The applicant can combine hours if accrued at different certified 501(c) 3 organizations.

Lancaster Rotary Club

This scholarship was established in 2004 to make a lasting and significant contribution to students graduating from a Fairfield County, Ohio High School.

Larry L. Hoover Memorial Scholarship

This scholarship was established by family and friends in memory of Larry L. Hoover. Recipients must be both: Junior or Senior in college AND majoring in an agricultural related field of study Examples include, Agricultural Engineering, Agricultural Communications, Animal Sciences, Veterinary Medicine or Food Science but not limited to. Applicants will be asked to specify their major in the additional apply to questions of the recommended opportunities.

Laverne Raab

Funds bequeathed by the late Laverne Raab have created an endowment for scholarships for graduates of Fairfield County, Ohio high schools. Funds are to be used for undergraduate scholarships.

Leroy and Bernice Ellinger Memorial

This scholarship was established for the purpose of providing educational scholarships for college students in the manner described below: 1. Applicant must be a college Junior or Senior. 2. Preference given to an accredited 4 year college 3. Any graduate of a Fairfield County, Ohio High School or from a High School in Worthington, Ohio 4. Preference given to a graduate of Lancaster High School 5. Recipient must have at least a 2.75 GPA as a college Junior.

Lorelei Owen Gibbs

The Lorelei Owen Gibbs Scholarship has been created to assist a Junior, Senior or Graduate student who is established in the future profession of Elementary Education (teacher) or Professional Nurse program. The desire is to assist one who has made a total commitment to either career. Student must be a Fairfield County resident.

Lynn and Lynda Freisner Fund

This scholarship is to award any student, Freshman through Graduate level, but only awarded for a single year for each student. Recipient must be a resident of Rushcreek Township or a member of Bremen Bethel Presbyterian Church. In addition, recipient must be attending either The Ohio State University or Ohio University.

Malinda Lifer

This scholarship was established in memory of Malinda who was an elementary teacher in the Lancaster Ohio School District. This scholarship is for Lancaster High School and Bloom-Carroll High School, Ohio graduates that are attending or will be attending Ohio University Lancaster to obtain a degree in the field of Elementary Education and must carry at least a 2.0 GPA.

Marlowe Brainard

This scholarship is to provide assistance that will make a lasting and significant contribution to students attending and graduating from Walnut Township Local (Millersport) High School, Ohio who desire to continue their education in the fields of Arts or Education. The committee shall make its selection based upon academic achievement and the financial situation of the applicants. The scholarship award may be made for a four year, two year or technical college education.

Matthew W. Acton Memorial Golf

This fund was established in memory of Matthew Acton to provide scholarships for a senior golf athlete of any Fairfield County, Ohio high school, Canal Winchester High School, Circleville High School, Logan Elm High School or Teays Valley High School. This scholarship is for any accredited college, vocational or technical school.

Mindi Wendel Memorial - Rotary

Don C. and Renee Wendel, Jr. established this fund in 1978 as a memorial to their daughter, Mindi, who was artistically talented. Eligible applicants must be a graduate of a Fairfield County, Ohio high school and should have exhibited a preference for and an interest in the visual arts by the applicant's high school activities. Recipients cannot receive the scholarship for more than four years and shall not be awarded for post-graduate study.

Mollee J. Seifert Scholarship Fund

This scholarship was established in loving memory of Mollee J. Seifert in 2001. Mollee graduated from Fisher Catholic in 1993 and Ohio State School of Cosmetology in 1995. She was tragically killed in an automobile accident on January 2, 2000, she was 25 years old. Mollee's parents, family & friends decided they would like her memory to live on by awarding scholarships each year to assist graduates of William V. Fisher Catholic High School and Lancaster High School in Fairfield County, Ohio.

Molly Ann Clark

This scholarship was established for students as follows: 1. Past participants (racers) of the Lancaster Soap Box Derby, past derby queens or have had a family that either volunteered or served on the board of directors of the Lancaster Soap Box Derby 2. Applicants must be from Fairfield, Perry, Pickaway, Hocking, Licking, Athens or Muskingum counties in Ohio 3. Must demonstrate an interest in volunteerism 4. A student seeking a degree in substance abuse education may be accepted every even year

Mt. Pleasant Kiwanis

To provide scholarships to graduates of Fairfield County, Ohio high schools or residents of Fairfield County, Ohio in the manner described below: 1. The high school and school the student plans to attend must be accredited by the North Central Assoc., Commission on Accreditation and School Improvement and must be a not for profit school. 2. The student must be a graduating senior 3. Student must show financial need.

Nils Gustavson Scholar Athlete

This scholarship is for the purpose of providing educational scholarships for a senior graduate of Lancaster High School, Ohio in the manner described below: 1. Recipient must be attending an Ohio college or university. 2. Recipient must be a student who, in the committee's opinion, has a good academic standing and has displayed the qualities of a scholar athlete. 3. Recipient should be involved in school athletics.

Officer Brett Markwood

This Scholarship was formed by Officer Brett Markwood's family and friends after Officer Markwood was shot in the line of duty. This scholarship is for residents of Fairfield County, Ohio to attend a police academy, a technical school for law enforcement training, or four-year college students starting their second, third or fourth year of college in a law enforcement related field.

Patricia Woodyard Gilmore Memorial Scholarship

This fund shall be used for the purpose of providing scholarships to students whom have graduated from a high school in Fairfield County. Said funds shall be distributed for application toward the tuition and/or related educational expenses of scholarship recipients in the manner described below:1. Scholarship made for a 4-year college or trade school program. 2. College or school in the state of Ohio. 3. Graduate of a high school in Fairfield County.

Paul D. Beck

Must be a graduate of a high school located in Fairfield County, Ohio. Recipients must demonstrate academic ability and maintain a 3.5 G.P.A. in high school and a 3.0 G.P.A. in any undergraduate program. Recipient must be a student who, in the committee's opinion, deserves assistance, even though they haven't qualified for other financial aid or scholarships.

R. Brian Cline

This fund shall be distributed for the purpose of providing educational scholarships to Fairfield County students who are seeking a degree and have been formally accepted into the College of Engineering at their public school/university in Ohio.

Robert C. Trocchia Music Scholarship

This scholarship is in honor of Robert Trocchia who retired from Fairfield Union School District after years of being Director of Music and receiving the Lifetime Achievement Award for the Fairfield Union Music Hall of Fame in 2009. Students must be a graduating senior from Fairfield Union High School who plan to attend college and pursue a career in Music.

Robert E. and Marion A. Carr

Mr. & Mrs. Carr established this scholarship in 2003 for students pursuing a degree in the study of Nursing and/or Teaching/Education. The recipients must be a resident of Fairfield County, Ohio. This award may be for a four or two year accredited college. Scholarship may be awarded up to four consecutive years; however recipient must reapply each year.

Robert Knisley Fire Service

The Lancaster Professional Firefighters I.A.F.F. Local 291 established this scholarship in 2007 as a memorial to the late Robert Bobby Knisley, a former Lancaster Firefighter. This Scholarship is for graduates of a Fairfield County, Ohio high school who are attending a college pursing a fire science degree or a vocational school pursuing a state of Ohio certification in a fire or EMS field. Children of present/former LFD members will be given preference and can be graduates of any high school.

Robert Rowles Family Fund

This fund is for the purpose of providing educational scholarships for students who are residents of Fairfield County, Ohio and are a graduate of Fairfield Union High School. Recipient must be enrolled in a post-secondary program and must have a financial need which might keep them from otherwise attending college.

Robert V. Grilli Memorial

Scholarship recipients shall be a graduate of either Lancaster High School or Fisher Catholic High School, Ohio, who intend to continue their education in the field of their choice in a four year, two year or technical college, post-secondary and/or graduate or doctorate institution. Recipient must show financial need.

Roger Anderson

Roger Anderson, who was the President of the Junction City Bank, and his wife established this fund to educate deserving students of New Lexington High School who reside in Jackson Township, in Perry County, Ohio. The student must be majoring in education or business.

Roger Pedigo Memorial

To provide educational scholarships for selected high school seniors who are residence of Athens, Hocking, Vinton, Fairfield and Franklin, Ohio Counties who are attending Ohio University in the manner described below: 1. Applicant must have maintained a high school G.P.A. of 3.0 or above 2. Applicant must possess leadership skills and participated in community service 3. Special favor will be given to applicants who exhibit financial need.

Rushcreek Grange

Formed by the Rushcreek Grange, this scholarship shall be for a graduating senior from a Fairfield County, Ohio high school who is a resident of Rushcreek Township, for at least 12 months prior to application. The committee shall make its selection based upon academic achievement and the financial situation of the applicants. It is the desire that the recipient be alcohol, tobacco, and drug free. The scholarship award may be made for a four-year, two year, or technical college education.

Russell N. and Clarice H. Stemen

This scholarship is for students who have been members of the Bremen Calvary United Methodist Church or the Bremen Bethel Presbyterian Church of Bremen, Ohio for at least 3 years preceding their senior year in high school. Selection shall be based on financial need. Preference will be given to those who have demonstrated the qualities of hard work, scholastic achievement, Christian moral values and

love of family and country. Academic achievement and leadership skills shall also be given special consideration. Scholarship may be awarded for a four year, two year, and vocational or technical college education.

Ruth E. Miller

This scholarship shall be for the purposes of providing an opportunity for a college and university education for persons from Lancaster, Ohio and Fairfield County, Ohio whose financial condition is such that they would not otherwise be able to procure a college or university education without the scholarship. Preference should be given to those applicants who have demonstrated the qualities of hard work, scholastic attainment, Christian moral values, and love of family and country.

Shannon Family

Richard F. Shannon was a graduate of Ohio University and a research scientist for Owens-Corning Fiberglass in Granville, Ohio. Mr. Shannon established this fund for Lancaster High School, Ohio graduates or graduating seniors attending Ohio University-Lancaster or Ohio University-Athens. This scholarship is unique in that there is no GPA consideration and priority will be given to those whose parents are deceased, single parent families and low income families. Recipients are restricted to a maximum of five years of funding.

Sportsmen's Environment & Conservation Association Kenny Stebelton Memorial

This will provide scholarships for residents of Fairfield County, Ohio or students who have graduated from a high school in Fairfield County. Scholarship recipients shall be in their junior or senior year of college, earning a four-year degree or in their second year of college, earning a two-year degree in one of the following areas: Conservation of natural resources, wildlife, and environment; Enhance and maintain wildlife environment and habitat; Forestry; and/or Agriculture.

Steven E. Svoboda Scholarship

This scholarship was created by Steven E. Svoboda's family in memory of him to provide educational scholarships for students pursuing a degree in the field of technology with special consideration given to students studying Engineering or Auto Mechanics. Specifically, students studying Engineering shall have the status of a college Junior. Students studying Auto Mechanics shall have completed at least 1 full year of technical training.

Stream & Wetlands Foundation

The Stream and Wetlands Foundation launched this scholarship to benefit students who are residents of Ohio and are attending a school in Ohio that show an exceptional level of commitment to the restoration of aquatic resources, water quality, and/or aquatic resource policy. The scholarship is available for students studying to obtain an Associate or Bachelor of Science degree in the field of environmental science that have completed 1 academic year and maintain a 2.5 or higher cumulative GPA.

Tammy Nusser Foundation

Tammy Nusser was a community volunteer and Chamber of Commerce staff member in Lancaster, Ohio, when she lost her long battle with cancer in 2012. Tammy was a friend to all and loved giving back to the community. Tammy planted the seeds for the idea for the Tammy Nusser Foundation, whose goal is to help people fighting cancer. The mission is to support those individuals who have cancer or their children, by awarding educational scholarships to help offset the cost of college expenses.

The Nauman Sampson Wittenberg - Rotary

For the purpose of providing educational scholarships for students who have graduated from a high school in Fairfield County, Ohio and is, or will be, attending Wittenberg University.

The Wilbur O. Turner & Anita M. Turner and The Mildred L. Hatter & Frank H. Hatter

This scholarship shall be used for tuition assistance for graduates of Lancaster High School who want to attend seminary school or pursue a career in the medical profession. Applicant major must be listed as: Health Sciences-Dental Hygiene, Health Sciences-Dentistry, Health Sciences-Nursing, Health Sciences-Optometry, Health Sciences-Medicine, Health Sciences-Other Medical Field or Seminary.

V. Ben Martin Scholarship

This scholarship was established by V. Ben Martin for residents of Fairfield County, Ohio who are furthering their education by attending the Fisher College of Business at Ohio State University. Proof of acceptance to Fisher will be required to be eligible for this scholarship.

Violet Grange #1949 Scholarship

This scholarship shall provide educational scholarships to any student graduating from Pickerington Schools or any student who lives in the Pickerington School District but attends high school for the purpose of enrolling in a Vocational Agriculture program which is not available in the Pickerington School District. The student must enroll at an accredited 2- or 4-year college, university or technology school and plan coursework leading to an Associate or Bachelors degree. The major and degree must be in studies such as Agricultural Business, Agricultural Engineering, Agriculture Production, Animal Science, Animal Services, Pre-Veterinary, Veterinary Technology, Food Science and Technologies, Horticulture, Plant Science, Soil Science, Forestry, Conservation, or Wildlife, in order to qualify for this scholarship. Recipients shall maintain a 2.75 GPA. Financial need is to be considered but is not mandatory when selecting recipient. The same student may apply/receive money up to four years and recipient must reapply to be considered for 2nd, 3rd or 4th year monies.

Weis Family

Established by Forest M. Weis to provide funds for scholarships to be awarded to persons residing in Fairfield County, Ohio and who have graduated from a high school in Fairfield County to attend Ohio University or one of its branches. Guidelines for selection of recipients are as following: All selections will be made on a basis of need and academic merit, all recipients shall be enrolled as a full-time student, all recipients must have had at least a 3.0 grade point average in high school, all recipients must maintain at least a 2.0 grade point average in college, recipients shall attend Ohio University-Lancaster

for their first two years, if reasonable, before transferring to Ohio University Athens or other state supported college or university in Ohio.

Wilfred L. and Una H. Fosnaugh Scholarship

This fund was established in 2005 by Wilfred Fosnaugh for residents of Fairfield County, Ohio who are pursuing a bachelor's degree in education at any accredited educational institution and is need based.

Willard (Fuzz) Smith - Rotary

This OUL scholarship was established in 1998 and was designed for the non-traditional student. Recipients are determined on the basis of: desire to achieve a degree, reason for returning to college, career goals, number of years of residency in Fairfield County and financial need. Recipient must be enrolled in 2 courses or a minimum of 6 credit hours per semester.

William D. Queen

Mr. Queen, a former math and computer teacher at Fairfield Union High School, set up this scholarship in 1993 to benefit students graduating from Fairfield Union, Ohio High School. Special consideration is given to candidates majoring in math or computer sciences and recipients must show financial need.
