Fairfield Community Health Center Grant Supports Renovations for South Elementary School

The Fairfield County Foundation recently awarded a grant from the George and Dollie L. Zimpfer Memorial Fund to the Fairfield Community Health Center (FCHC) to aid in the purchase of a high-tech security system that will cover both the inside and the outside of the clinic building.



"We were honored to receive our full funding request for this project. The impact the South Elementary School renovation will have on our organization, and in turn, the community, will be immeasurable," FCHC CEO Lisa Evangelista said.

"A quality security system is an integral part of our overall building renovation project, and funding from the George and Dollie L. Zimpfer Memorial Fund was critical in this project coming to fruition. Thank you for your generosity and support," said FCHC Fundraising and Marketing Manager Chris Skaggs. "The safety and security of our staff and our patients is paramount to our ability to do the work we do at FCHC. The security system portion of the South School renovation truly impacts everyone who steps foot in the building, providing peace of mind and comfort to our staff, patients, vendors, and visitors. We are excited to be able to expand our behavioral health team to take on more diverse cases, which will enhance our overall community impact."

The Fairfield Community Health Center's new building located at the old South School site at 220 E. Walnut Street is slated to open later this summer. The Fairfield County Foundation is proud to support this endeavor and excited about the expansion of health services in our community.

Katie McKibben Coates Scholarship

The Katie McKibben Coates Scholarship Fund has been established to memorialize Katie McKibben Coates, a past elementary Intervention Specialist within the Millersport Local School District. Katie passed away in 2021 while on vacation with her husband.

Katie lettered in several sports while in high school and went on to receive her degree in education from Bowling Green State University. She also had a passion for volunteering for the Special Olympics.

Katie taught as an Intervention Specialist in Seattle, WA, and Columbus, OH before finding her perfect fit at Millersport Elementary School. She loved teaching and she loved her students—both the students she had in class, as well as her student council kids. She strived to make her classroom a place where students could learn within a safe and encouraging environment. She was instrumental in starting the Millersport Elementary Student Council and strived to make it an asset to the students and the school.

Katie's scholarship will be eligible to graduates of Millersport High School who participated in student council at any level (elementary, middle, or high school), who are pursuing higher education and demonstrate leadership skills, and a commitment to their community.
