George was a teacher at Lancaster High School from 1964 to 1996, teaching primarily civics and economics to seniors. Marilyn taught at Lancaster City Schools from 1964 to 1994, teaching math to mostly freshman. When she retired she was teaching at Stanbery Freshman School. Both dedicated their life to teaching as a profession. This scholarship is dedicated to their memory and to assist new teachers to follow in their footsteps. This scholarship is based on financial need and the recipient must be a graduate from Lancaster High School attending college to major in the field of Education. Current college students must have a GPA of 3.0 or higher.





A community foundation is a non-profit, publicly supported, nonsectarian philanthropic institution with a long-term goal of building permanent funds established by many donors to carry out their

charitable interests, and for the broad-based charitable interest of and for the residents of a defined geographic area.
